Principal's Message

The capacity to learn is a gift; The ability to learn is a skill; The willingness to learn is a choice.

Our Year 12 students and College I students are two-thirds of the way through the current HSC examinations and have just over a week to go before all the examinations are complete. I commend them all on the way that they have conducted themselves during this period. It has been heartening to see so many come to school to use the Library to study. It has also been good to hear from the College I students, in particular, who can now fully see the value of the approach and model that we have adopted.

I know that students across the rest of the school are approaching with some anticipation Week 6 and the roll over process – particularly our incoming College I students.

Schools are living organisms. Every six years the student body changes completely and often such changes are mirrored amongst staff. In 2014 we can expect to see many changes to staff for a number of reasons. Firstly, I need to publicly congratulate Mrs White on her permanent promotion to Assistant Principal at Thurgoona Public School and Miss Williamson who has accepted a position as Head Teacher Secondary Studies at Bowraville Central School. These are wonderful opportunities for them both as they further develop their knowledge and skills for the benefit of students across the state and we wish them well when they take up these positions next year. As replacements and other arrangements are put in place I will inform the school community.

A Parent /Teacher Afternoon will take place on Tuesday 12 November 2013 from 3.30 pm-5.30 pm. If parents are unable to attend during this time and wish to speak to staff please contact the school to make other arrangements. As per discussions with the P&C it was decided that we would shift parent /teacher afternoons to mid-semester to allow parents to have a bigger impact on their children's progress. This will be formally implemented in 2014. Accordingly, the dates for parent/teacher afternoons in 2014 are as follows; Tuesday 4 March 2014 and Tuesday 19 August 2014.

Mrs Dodd will be the sole Assistant Principal in the school from 2014 and again we will be staffing four classes; Kindergarten, 1/2, 3/4, and 5/6. In the past there has been some confusion about roles of executive and I thought I would take a moment to provide some clarity. Despite the titles Head Teachers and Assistant Principals are exactly the same, they just have different areas of responsibility.
