Just a few statistics; 50% of our students had above 95% attendance, just under 10% had 100% attendance for the school year. Missing school puts gaps in your education so it is wonderful to see so many students with such high attendance. I know that there were significant numbers of students with between 90% and 95% attendance as well.

100% of students were awarded Bronze level; 93% Silver; 76% Gold; 42% Platinum; just on 10% received Double Platinum level and 5% of students achieved the new "Learning Super Hero Award".
