

They were joined by the in-coming 2017 Kindergarten class who were all highly excited and took part in an enthusiastic manner.






### No Hat! No Play!


As the warmer months approach it is a reminder that students will need to wear their hats in the playground. If students forget they will be required to stay under the cola or go to the Learning Hub.



A whole school assembly was held on Friday 11 November 2016 to acknowledge and remember our fallen diggers.


One minute's silence was observed and addresses were given by both school captains and also members of our senior school.
