Well done to Year 8 who were fully engaged in the lesson and showed great maturity to work together as a team.




AUSTRALIAN ALL SCHOOLS TRACK AND FIELD NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Jack competed in one of two final heats and came second with a new personal best time of 2.09.33. He placed 6th overall from a field of 14 boys representing all states of Australia.






ROBOTICS TEAM UPDATE

TIMOTHY GARDNER WINS AWARD


