



National Tree Day planting goes to heart of NAIDOC Week 2021 theme

'Heal Country'

Thursday 29 July 2021

This year's NAIDOC theme – 'Heal Country', coincided with National Tree Day allowing students from Batlow Technology School in Years K-6 the opportunity to reflect on and celebrate NAIDOC Week including National Tree Day on Thursday 29 July 2021.

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The theme of NAIDOC Week this year is "Heal Country".

'Heal Country' means "embracing the cultural understanding and knowledge of First Nations people in protecting and maintaining the land for generations to come and also being mindful of our footsteps and our impacts on country".

Events like NAIDOC Week are an ideal opportunity to highlight our commitment to Aboriginal education and celebrate the achievements of our staff and students.

On Thursday 29 July 2021, Batlow Technology School K-6 students were greeted with an Acknowledgement to Country by Batlow Technology School and a primary school Annie Jones before participating in mini workshops, held throughout periods 4 and 5; which included:

- Dreamtime Stories (Miss Singleton)

- Indigenous Native Garden / Tree Planting (Ms Field)

- Indigenous Symbol Art (Miss Fallon)

and

- Indigenous Cooking (Mr Dewar)

Our school's results will be registered with Planet Ark for National Tree Day. The effort of every student who participated will be counted and uploaded to the Tree Day support team.

Around 20 trees and shrubs were planted on Thursday 29 July by students in Years K-6. The students who participated in National Tree Day will be presented with certificates by Ms. Field on Tuesday 10 August 2021 (Week 5).

Ms Field said that "tree planting was a great way to inspire our students to learn about their local environment while playing an active role in their school community". Thank you very much to Ms Jenny Brown for her assistance with this activity.

The RHLN is a not-for-profit community organisation and provides locally grown native plants for Landcare and community projects and for sale to the general public.

Ms Field, staff and students of Batlow Technology School, would like to say a huge "thank you" to the Riverina Highlands Landcare Nursery (RHLN) for supplying our school with the variety of trees and shrubs needed to plant on National Tree Day.

The Nursery specialises in growing native plants to suit the region's local climatic conditions. Over 60,000 plants are grown each year, including a range of trees, shrubs, groundcovers, sedges, grasses and climbers.

The RHLN is located on the Gocup Road Tumut, approximately 300m from the intersection with the Snowy Mountains Highway.
